
Free pattern
Clip holder/bag
Materials

15inch sq outer fabric15inch sq lining fabric15inch sq iron on wadding or pellon12 x 2.5inch strip for handles

Cutting

Take the outer fabric and mark in each corner on the back of the fabric a 5inch square as pictured




Then layer the 2 fabrics and wadding together and cut these 5inch Squares out of each corner of all 3 pieces. Put these aside for now. We will use them later.

Construction

Take the small piece of fabric 2.5in x 12in and fold in half long ways and then open out and fold in both long edges to your center fold. The fold again along the center fold encasing the raw edges inside the fabric. (Just like you would for bias binding)



Stitch down the open edge 1/4in in from fold Cut this strip into 2 pieces to use for the 2 handles

Now using the front fabric of your bag iron on your pellon or pin/clip in place your wadding onto the wrong side of the fabric lining up the edges.


With right sides together fold or corner of the bag together as pictured, lining up the cut out in the corner.



Take the corner and fold it to meet the other corner

It will look strange but repeat for each corner making sure to catch both wadding and front fabric with a 1/2 inch seam

As pictured




Once you have all 4 corners sewn together trim off any excess.

You then repeat this corner step for the lining,

Once the 2 bag parts are made, take the handles and place them in the center of one side of the outer of the bag pinning them evenly with a 2inch gap. Repeat for the other side making sure the handles line up.

You can stitch them in place using a 1/8th seam



Then once these are sewn in place, grab the lining and with right sides together slip the bag outer into the lining.

Match your seams and clip or pin in place.

Sew around the top of the bag making sure to leave a 3inch opening for turning.


Back stitch the start and stop of the seam to secure it. Turn your bag right side out.

Once this is done you will then need to top stitch the bag front top edge making sure to have the handles facing up and the lining showing a little to give it the appearance of having a trim.

This top stitch will also sew down the opening you had for turning the bag.

So now you're almost done!.

Lastly to make the bag pinch a little take each corner of the top of the bag and pinch it tightly. And sew 1/4inch from the top edge down, as pictured.



The top of your bag should pinch in nicely on the top edge now.



Now you are done

Press the side seams to help the shape of the bag. You can use a clip or fastener to keep closed if you wish.
